The 4-H Committee members are to attend meetings, work on standing committees, and work with Extension staff members in promoting 4-H programming across Butler County.

4-H Advisors are encouraged to complete this application and submit it so a ballot can be composed for elections to the 4-H Committee can be held at the annual 4-H meeting in December. At the 4-H annual meeting, advisors are given changes to curricula, revisions to membership forms, deadlines for submitting paperwork, exhibit changes, and changes from the Junior Fair Board. This is a very important meeting for 4-H Advisors to attend.
