# Hello 4-H Families,





Saturday April 30 from 9:00a.m. – 6:00p.m (Single Day Camp)


Sunday May 1 from 9:00a.m. – 6:00p.m. (Single Day Camp)

- A current Ohio 4-H member living within Butler County
- Must not have previously received the scholarship award for which they applied
- Must have at least achieved the "academic rank" of "senior" in high school
   Application Requirements:
- Completed application form, signed by member, parent, and advisor
- A current transcript of grades
- A one-page letter of support from your academic advisor, guidance counselor, teacher, community leader, or employer
- A two-page, single-sided, double-spaced personal 4-H story that shares how 4-H contributed to your personal development, leadership skills, and career plans
- A one-page essay that talks about the township you live in or township Trustees as a whole
- You MUST submit 4 copies of all materials
- Refer to application for additional details on formatting and requirements

# Rork Award Due April 1st

Amount: Two \$100 scholarships

  - Type limit: Arial 11 point font with  $\frac{1}{2}$ " left and right margins
- Copy of acceptance letter from school (or schools if still deciding)
- One-page letter of recommendation from a 4-H Advisor, Teacher, Counselor, etc.


