Ohio. By 1905, there were over 2,000 youth, within sixteen

counties, partaking in similar programs to that of the "original"

Agricultural Club. Graham wanted to give the boys that were

• interested the basic knowledge in farm work on an elementary

learning level. But, for the girls, they learned the essential facts

of domestic economy. Mr. Graham was looking ahead and seeing

what great things 4-H was doing and was seeing what the future

could hold for these members. Look now at what 4-H is all about!


Back then it was all about livestock and farming, and now there






